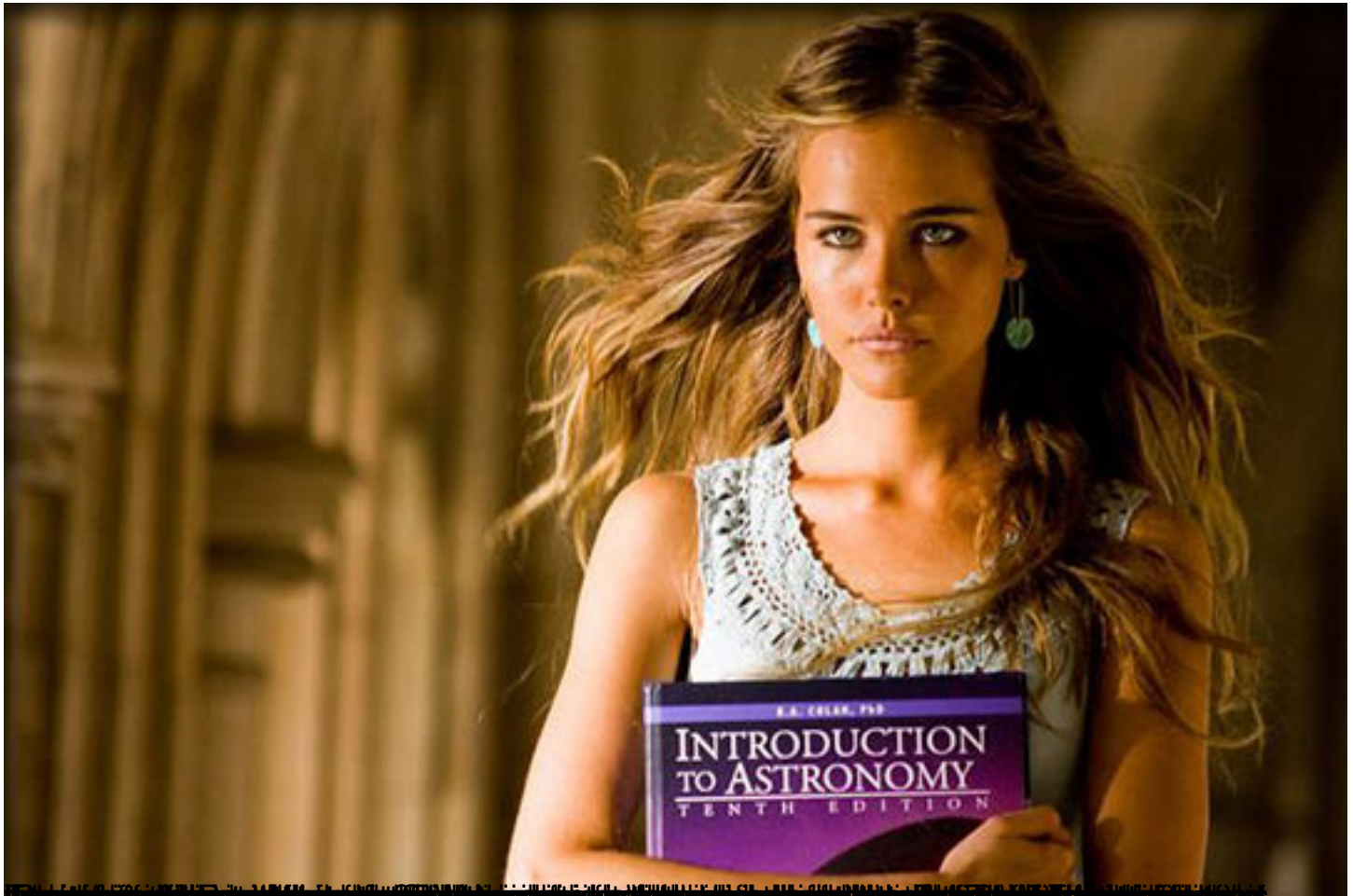




Transformers: Revenge of the Fallen
